Schedule of Events:

Friday: 10:00hrs: Registration ends. (Registration after 10:00hrs is subject to an additional fee of €20 per participant!)
(Late entries may be denied participation or charged an extra fee.)
11:00hrs: Team leader meeting
12:00hrs: Competition starts
(If possible, first event will be the giant slalom. The order of events may be changed by the meet director.)

Saturday: Competition day

Sunday: 16:00hrs: Competition ends

PARACHUTING:

Number of Rounds: Maximum five, minimum two; NO final round.

Start Order:
- In reverse order, based on the giant slalom team ranking.
- If the competition starts with parachuting, the start order of the teams will be determined by draw.

Measuring Range:

Dead center disc is 3cm; electronic measuring from 0-15cm.
Any scores exceeding 15cm (outside measuring device) will be given a score of 50cm!!
(no manual measurements!)

SKIING:

Number of Heats:

Two.

Start Order:

- Based on the last and current season's European Paraski Cup giant slalom final ranking.
- The best 15 competitors may choose a start number between 1 and 15, in order of their ranking. All other competitors will start according to the giant slalom ranking list. The organizer will determine the start order of all competitors who do not appear in the ranking list by draw. They will start after all other competitors. These regulations also apply to women competitors who will race before the men.

GS Regulations:

See FIS Regulations for elevation difference, distance between gates, number of gates, etc.

GS Scoring:

The winning time for each heat should be one minute.
Each heat will be scored separately and converted to centimeters (points) using a factor of 0.32 (same as in World Championship Regulations).
A factor of 0.64 is used if only two rounds of parachuting are completed.

Maximum Score:

The maximum score in each heat is 150cm! This score is given if a competitor is disqualified or clocks a time equivalent to or exceeding 150cm (points). A maximum score of 300cm (points) can be awarded, e.g., if a competitor fails to finish both heats.

Boarder Regulations:

Boarders are treated like skiers. They appear in the giant slalom ranking list which then determines their start order, so boarders and skiers are absolutely treated the same in the giant slalom event!!!

Competitors must decide before the race whether to start as skiers OR boarders (in both heats!)

CLASSIFICATION:

Individual Classification: MEN Combined (no minimum number of competitors required)

WOMEN Combined (no minimum number of competitors required)

JUNIORS Combined (24 years or older) (no minimum number of competitors required)

MASTERS Combined (50 years or older) (no minimum number of competitors required)

BOARDERS Combined (no minimum number of competitors required)

Team Classification:

TEAM Combined (mixed teams comprising men, women and boarders!!)

The fastest giant slalom time achieved in each category (men, women, juniors, masters, boarders) is converted to centimeters (points) and used to determine the final ranking of all competitors.

In the team classification, the fastest time overall is used to determine the final team ranking.

It is up to the organizer to award any medals, diplomas, prize money and merchandise gifts.

ENTRY FEES:

€180 per participant in Germany and Austria

€200 per participant in Switzerland

The entry fee includes:

- Five parachute jumps and re-jumps
- Ski pass
- Organizational fee
- One dinner

There will be a reimbursement of €2 for each jump not made.

- TOTAL SCORE -

Individual Classification: MEN Combined (no minimum number of competitors required)

WOMEN Combined (no minimum number of competitors required)

JUNIORS Combined (24 years or older) (no minimum number of competitors required)

MASTERS Combined (50 years or older) (no minimum number of competitors required)

BOARDERS Combined (no minimum number of competitors required)

Team Classification: TEAM Combined (mixed teams comprising men, women and boarders!!)

- A final classification will be established once a minimum of two events have been carried out and scored.
- The team designation must not change in the final team classification.
- No more than two members per team may be replaced in the subsequent European Cup competition.
- A tie is broken by determining first the number of participations, and then the better individual result.
- In one winter season, the number of individual competitions held is limited to four (4), to be awarded by the EC Paraski Organization.
